

J. Thomas Sherrard Jun<sup>r</sup> having been duly appointed  
and sworn a Commissioner under and by virtue of an Act  
made in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the reign of King William the  
Fourth Intituled "An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively  
in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth years of  
the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing  
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland; and  
to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix  
a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing  
yielded or payable within the Parish of Carrickbogget in the  
County of Louth, do hereby certify, that the true and just  
amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the  
said Parish is Fifty Seven pounds eight Shillings and six  
pence Sterling by the year, the entire of which Sum £ 57: 8: 6  
is due and payable to The Rev<sup>d</sup> Alexander Lindsay as a Com-  
-position for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector and sole owner  
of the Tithes of said parish— And I do further certify  
that the average price of Wheat, being the corn principally  
grown in such County, for the Period of seven years ending  
on the first day of November 1830 is Thirty two Shillings and  
ten pence halfpenny Sterling per Barrel—
