

duly appointed and sworn under and  
by virtue of the several acts of Parliament  
theretofore made and provided for establishing  
the composition in Ireland to  
ascertain and fix a true and just  
composition for all tithes arising growing  
yielded and payable within the Parish of  
Carraigtwall in the Diocese of Cloyne  
and County of Cork did certify under  
his hand that the true and just amount  
of composition for all tithes within said  
Parish was then £ 1035. 4. 0 sterling  
by the year of which sum one third  
part was due and payable to the  
Reverend Henry Johnson as a composition  
for all tithes claimable by him as  
Vicar of said Parish and two thirds  
was due and payable to Elizabeth Luker  
the Elder Elizabeth Luker the younger  
and Griselda Luker the representatives  
of the late George Luker Esquire as the  
composition for all tithes claimable by  
them as Lay Impropriator of said Parish  
and further that the average price of wheat  
being the corn principally grown in  
said County for the period of seven years  
ending the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1830  
was

was £ 1. 12. 0½ per barrel and  
Whereas Thomas Ronayne Drafied, Arthur  
Hugh Smith-Barry, Thomas West Gubbins  
John O'Connell Julian Martin and  
Hughes Martin being three or more  
persons in said Parish of Carraigtwall  
each charged with the annual  
payment of £ 3 and upwards in  
respect of the Rent charge now  
payable in said Parish in lieu  
of said Composition for all tithes  
caused notice in writing dated the  
4<sup>th</sup> day of May 1896 and signed  
by each of them to be affixed to the  
principal outer door of the church  
of said Parish and to be also  
affixed to the Principal outer door  
of every known place of Religious  
worship in said Parish on two  
successive Sundays that is to say  
on Sunday the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May  
1896 and Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup> day of  
June 1896 signifying their intent  
to make application to the Justices  
of the Peace for the County of Cork  
at the next ensuing General  
Quarter Sessions of the Peace in  
and
