East Riding

Whereas at a General Sessions of the peace held at
 Mallon in and for the East Riding of the County of Cork
 on the fourth day of April 1826 upon hearing the appeal of Edward
 Creed Esq: Appellant against the assessment or applotment of the Commissioners
 of the Parish of Castleblayney pursuant to the provisions of an Act of Parliament
 made in the fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth
 It was ordered and directed by the Justices of the Peace then and there assembled
 that seventy three acres and eleven perches of the lands of Ballydough in said
 Parish of Castleblayney in the possession of the said Edward Creed heretofore
 assessed and applotted by the said Commissioners in the first Class in
 their book of the applotment at the rate of five shillings per acre,
 should be placed in the fourth Class, and be assessed and applotted
 at the rate of four shillings per acre, and that sixty five acres and twenty
 three perches another part of said lands of Ballydough in the possession
 of the said Edward Creed heretofore assessed and applotted by the said
 Commissioners in the first class at the rate of four shillings and six pence
 per acre should be placed in the fifth class, and be assessed and applotted
 at the rate of three shillings and six pence per acre, and that the deficiency which
 should be thereby occasioned in the total amount of the Composition for said Parish
 by reason of the reductions which should be made in the proportion of said
 Composition payable by the said Edward Creed should be supplied by a re-assessment
 or re-applotment to be made upon the lands appealed against being the several
 lands hereinafter mentioned according to the respective values of the same, and
 that said applotment or assessment should be amended accordingly. And Whereas
 by reason of the said amendment the amount of the proportion of the Composition
 payable by the said Edward Creed namely the sum of £32-19-1/2 has been
 reduced to the sum of £32-0-11 leaving a deficiency in the amount of said Composition
 of a sum of £6-18-2/2 - 1800. in pursuance of said order and directions of
 the said Justices and in order to supply the said deficiency a re-assessment or
 re-applotment has been made by the said Commissioners of the several lands
 herein after mentioned being the lands appealed against in the following manner
 that is to say -

 shillings per acre, are now assessed at the rate of five pence per acre
 yearly additional amounting to the sum of £1-1-3
 making the total sum to be paid yearly by the said Mich Mackey
 for said part of said lands the sum of £13-15-2

 Michael Mackey heretofore assessed by the said Commissioners
 in the third Class at four shillings and six pence per acre, are
 now assessed at the rate of four pence per acre yearly
 additional amounting to the sum of - - - - - 0-18-7
 making the total sum to be paid yearly by the said
 Michael Mackey for said part of said lands the sum
 of £12-14-0

Other part of said lands of Mchery in the possession of Phillip
 Gilliland heretofore assessed by the said Commissioners in
 the third Class at four shillings and six pence per acre, are
 now assessed at the rate of four pence per acre yearly
 additional amounting to the sum of - - - - - 0-13-9
 making the total sum to be paid yearly by the said
 Phillip Gilliland for said part of said lands the sum
 of £9-9-3

Other part of said lands of Mchery in the possession of
 John Bramfield heretofore assessed by said Commissioners
 in the third Class at four shillings and six pence per acre,
 and now assessed at the rate of four pence per acre
 yearly additional amounting to the sum of - - - - - 1-2-10 1/2
 making the total sum to be paid yearly by the
 said John Bramfield for said part of said lands
 the sum of £15-13-4 1/2

Other part of said lands of Mchery in the possession of Robert
 Smith and Henry Smith heretofore assessed by said Commissioners
 in the fourth Class at four shillings per acre, are now assessed
 at the rate of three pence per acre yearly additional
 amounting to the sum of - - - - - 1-6-5 1/2
 making the total sum to be paid yearly by the said Robert
 Smith and Henry Smith for said part of said lands the sum
 of £20-17-1
