In the Matter of the Composition for all Tithes and the Rent Charge now payable in lieu thereof in the parish of Castlemagner in the County of Cork and in Cork County East Riding and Division of Mallow and in the Matter of the first and second Victoria Chapter 109 and the statutes therein referred to and 14 and 15 Vic Chapter 57

By the Justices of the Peace for the County of Cork assembled at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace at Kintirkinn and for said County and in and for Cork County East Riding and Division of Mallow this 8<sup>th</sup> day of February 1847-

Whereas by a Certificate made and dated the 15<sup>th</sup> day of October 1833 John Lynch Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of the several Acts of Parliament theretofore made and provided for establishing Tithes Composition in Ireland to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded and payable within the parish of Castlemagner in the Diocese of Cloyne and County of Cork did certify under his hand that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes within said parish was then £809. 5. 1 by the year of which sum £404. 12. 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> was due and payable to the Reverend Joseph K. Cotton as a Composition for all the Tithes claimable by him as vicar of said parish and the sum of £404. 12. 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> was due and payable to Jeremiah Callaghan Esquire as Lay Impropriator of such parish and further that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1830 was £1. 12. 10 per barrel.
