Lurney Esquire and Thomas Boyce Esquire being three and more persons in said parish of Castlemagner each charged with the annual payment of £3 Sterling and upwards in respect of the Rent charge now payable in said parish in lieu of said Composition caused a notice in writing signed by each of them to be affixed to the principal outer door of the church of said parish And also to the principal outer door of every place of religious worship in said parish on two successive Sundays that is to say on Sunday the 10th day of May 1896 and on Sunday the 17th day of May 1896 signifying their intent to apply and that they would apply to the Justices of the Peace for the County of Cork at the then next ensuing General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held at Kanturk in and for said County and in and for said County East Riding and Division of Mallow (being the County in which said parish of Castlemagner is situate) the twenty sixth day of June 1896 to have the average price of wheat being the Corn in said original Certificate of said John Lynch mentioned for the seven years preceding inquired of and ascertained from the Dublin Gazette in order that the amount of said Tithe Composition and the Rent charge now payable in lieu thereof in said parish of Castlemagner may be varied and increased or diminished and the apportionment thereof varied and amended for the seven years ensuing the first day of November 1896 in proportion to such average price when ascertained as aforesaid and to have said Tithe Composition and Rent charge and the apportionment thereof varied and increased or diminished and amended accordingly And whereas said Sir John Wixson Becher.
