

I John Lynch Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn under and
by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third years of the Reign
of King William the fourth, entitled an Act to Amend three Acts
passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, seventh, and eighth years of the Reign
of this late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions per-
manent, to ascertain and fix the true and just Amount of Composition
for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable in the Parish of Castle-
magna in the Diocesis of Cloyne, and County of Cork, Do hereby certify, that
the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever in
said Parish, is eight Hundred, and nine Pounds, five Shillings, and one
Penny ^{the} by the year, of which sum, of eight Hundred, and nine Pounds,
five shillings and one penny, four Hundred, Pounds, are due, and pay-
able to the Rev^d Joseph. B. Cotton, as a Composition for the Tithe Claim-
able by him as Vicar of the S. Parish, And the sum of four Hundred
and nine Pounds, five shillings, and one Penny, are due and pay-
able, every year, to Jamesth Callaghan Esq^r Lay Impropriator of
said Parish, And I do further certify, that the Average price of Wheat
being the Corn principally grown in S. County for the Period of
Seven Years, ending on the 1st day of Nov^r. 1830 is one Pound
twelve Shillings and ten Pence p^r Barrel.
