

We the undersigned Joseph Bradshaw and Thomas Hunt Commissioners appointed under the Tythe composition Act find the Parish of Castletown in the County of Limerick to contain by our survey and valuation thereof 1034 acres 1 Rood 11 perches Irish Plantation Measure of which we find that 500 acres maketh 1st class or quality are worth £1.16.11¹/₄ British per acre shall pay the sum of £0.1.7¹/₄ British per acre and so in proportion for Roods and perches as a composition for the Tythes thereof, and we find that 464 acres ~~and~~ 24 perches maketh second class or quality are worth £1.7.8¹/₄ British per acre shall pay the sum of 1¹/₄ British per acre and so in proportion for Roods and perches as a composition for the Tythes thereof, and we find that 70 acres and 24 perches maketh 3rd class or quality worth £0.43.10¹/₄ British per acre shall pay the sum of 0¹/₄ British per acre and so in proportion for Roods and perches as a composition for the Tythes thereof. And finally we find that the above mentioned sums payable out of the above mentioned qualities of Land make the sum of £67.2.10¹/₄ British being the sum agreed upon as a composition for the Tythes of the parish of Castletown aforesaid.
