= We William Lloyd Galbraith and William Walker Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of King George the Fourth "entituled an act to provide for the establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time," to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the parish of Clonbrony in the County of Limerick.
= Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said parish, claimable by Mess^{rs} Richard Armstrong & Charles Armstrong, and Richard Armstrong Esq^{rs} as Assignees of the Honourable and Rev^d George D' Beresford of the Lease thereof made to him by His Grace the Archbishop of Tuam is, One Hundred and thirty five pounds by the year. And which sum of One hundred and thirty five pounds, is due and payable to the said Mess^{rs} Armstrongs out of that portion of the Parish comprising the following Townlands viz: Aughlanore, Aughneashanagh, Aughavard, Baluascrava, Ballyreahan, Carrickateen, Castlebawn, Clonbrony, Gloneasts, Coillian, Deraneal, Drumaharra, Drunnderagg, Glenshannon, Kilshrewly, Kiltaclogh, Knockinuddy, Leitrim, Lislea Lisstrake, Loughhill-Edgeworth, Loughilladere, Liphatican, Bruckles town, Rosebegg, Rosinore, and Tullybawn. — And that the said sum of one hundred and thirty five pounds by the year is to continue without variation for Twenty one years.
