 Reign of King George the Fourth, "intituled an act
 to provide for the Establishing of compositions for Tithes
 in Ireland for a limited Time", to ascertain and fix
 a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising
 growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of
 Clabrony in the County of Longford,

Do hereby certify that the true and just
 amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within
 the said Parish, claimable by the Reverend George
Crawford, the Vicar of said Parish, is One Hundred and
Eighty pounds by the year, ———— and that
 the said Sum of One Hundred and Eighty pounds
 by the year is to continue without Variation
 for Twenty One years.

And we do further certify, that the Average
 price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such
 County, for the period of seven years ending on the first
 day of November 1821, was is Fifteen Shillings and
two pence per Barrel.
