2nd & 3rd William 4th Chap 119

I Philip Francis Drought, Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the fourth Chap 119, entitled an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent; to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Florence County of Limerick and Diocese of of Limerick, do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two hundred and fifty five pounds Sterling by the year of which sum, eighty five pounds being the one third is due and payable to the Reverend John Croker as a parson for all Tithes claimed by him as Vicar, and that One hundred and seventy pounds being the remaining two thirds is due and payable to the Trustees of the late Countess of Cromwell deceased, as lay impropriator.

And I do further certify that average price of Wheat being the corn principally grown in said County, for the period of seven years ending the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty is one pound ten shillings and three pence half penny per barrel of twenty Stone given under my hand this second day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.
