ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
for all tithes arising, growing, yielding or payable
within the parish of Cloucrew and County
of Limerick, Do hereby Certify that having
examined into the average amount of tithes
paid, agreed or adjudged for the tithes
thereof, for seven years next preceding the first
day of November one thousand Eight Hundred and
Thirty, I do find that the true and just
amount of Composition for all tithes whatso-
ever within said parish is Seventy ^{and two} pounds Sterling
by the year, which said sum is due and
payable to the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop
Limerick - Ardferret & Shadoc, and his
Successors as Rectors of said parish, And
I do further Certify that it appearing in
evidence before me, that in order to do
away the objections to tithes Patuators and
to prevent the expenses attendant on them
to the said parishioners, the said Lord
Bishop has been in the habit of settling said
parish.
