

We Robert Howard Nolan of Portachappel, and
William Thomson of Allaghadeny, both in the County of Donegal
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue
of an Act, made in the 4th year of the Reign of his late Majesty,
King George the fourth, intituled "An Act to provide for the establishing
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, for a limited time" which Act
was afterwards amended by another Act passed in the 5th year of
the same Reign, and both which said Acts were afterwards amended
by an Act, passed in the 7th and 8th year of the same Reign,
and which said three Acts were afterwards amended by an Act,
passed in the third year of the Reign of his present Majesty King
William the Fourth, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the
Parish of Cloudeyharkey in the Diocese of Raphoe and County
of Donegal.

Do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Compensation
for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Two hundred
and Eighty pounds Sterling by the year. which sum is
due and payable to Rev^d Doctor Cornelius Henry Usher as a
Compensation for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of said
Parish, said unusual sum of Two hundred and Eighty pounds,
having been agreed to by the Rev^d Doctor Cornelius Henry Usher
Rector as aforesaid, with the Assent in writing of the Lord Bishop
of Raphoe the Bishop of the Diocese, and the Provost of Trinity College
Dublin, the Patron of the Parish accepted at a special Vestry duly
