

We William Palmer Esq<sup>r</sup> and the Rev<sup>d</sup> Nathaniel Brindley Mahaffy,  
Act<sup>s</sup> Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue  
of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the  
fourth intitled "an Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions  
for tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix  
a true and just Composition for all tithes arising, growing,  
yielding, and payable within the Parish of Dalkey in the County  
of Dublin do hereby certify that the true and just amount of  
Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish of  
Dalkey is Twenty three Pounds five Shillings and six pence by  
the year. Of which sum of Twenty three Pounds five Shil-  
lings and six pence, Two third parts, namely fifteen pounds  
ten shillings and four pence are due and payable to the  
Hon<sup>ble</sup> and Right Rev<sup>d</sup> Charles Lord Bishop of Wildfare as  
a Composition for the tithe claimable by him as Dean of  
Christ Church Dublin, and one third part, namely seven  
Pounds fifteen shillings and two pence is due and payable  
to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Charles Lindsay Act<sup>s</sup> as a Composition for the  
tithe claimable by him as Perpetual Curate of the said  
Parish.

And we do further certify that the average Price of  
Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such  
County for the period of seven years ending on first  
day of November 1821 pursuant to a Schedule furnished by  
the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> Henry Goulburn Chief Secretary to the Lord  
Lieutenant of Ireland is one Pound eighteen shillings and  
eight pence half penny per Barrel.
