an Act for the establishing of Compensation for Tithes
in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and
fix a true and just Compensation for all Tithes growing
arising yielded and payable within the said Parish
of Donagh in the County of Monaghan Do
herty Certify that the true and just amount of
Compensation for all Tithes whatsoever within the said
Parish is Four Hundred Sixty five pounds Six
pence of which sum of Four Hundred Sixty five
pounds Six pence Two third parts is due and payable
to William Blagney ^{of the Bishop of Clogher} Vicar of the said
Parish and one third
part of said sum of Four Hundred Sixty five pounds
amounting to the sum of One Hundred fifty five pounds
is due and payable to the Reverend William Henry
Pratt as a Compensation for the Tithes claimed by
him as Vicar of the said Parish

And We do further Certify that the average
Price of Cabs being the Compensation given for the
period of Seven years ending on the first day of
November 1830 is ^{Twenty shillings and six pence} ~~Twenty shillings~~
