

The John Lithgow & John Dyball Commissioners duly appointed and
sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year
of the Reign of King George the Fourth, entitled an Act to provide
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a
limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
for all Tithes Arising, Growing, Yielding or payable within the
Parish of Donagh in the County of Donegal do hereby Certify
that true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes what-
soever within the said parish is, Three Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds
British Sterling by the Year by agreement, to continue for the
term of Twenty one Years from the first day of November next,
which sum is due and payable annually to the Rev^d George Mar-
shall and his Successors Rectors of said Parish for the space of
Twenty one Years, the said Rev^d George Marshall being the
only Claimant of Tithes in said Parish, Given under our
hands this 19th day of June 1828
