 fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes growing
 arising yielded and payable within the said Parish
 of Donagh in the County of Monaghan Do
 hereby Certify that the true and just amount of
 Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said
 Parish is Four Hundred Sixty five pounds Say
 by the Year of which Sum of Four Hundred Sixty five
 pounds Sterl. Two third parts is due and payable
 to William Blagney Wicar ^{the Lord Bishop of Clogher} of the appropriate
 Tithes of said Parish of Donagh and one third
 part of said Sum of Four Hundred Sixty five pounds
 amounting to the Sum of One Hundred fifty five pounds
 is due and payable to the Reverend William Henry
 Pratt as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by
 him as Vicar of the said Parish

And We do further Certify that the average
 Price of Cabs being the Corn principally grown for the
 period of Seven years ending on the first day of
 November 1830 is ^{from present value} ~~Twenty~~ ^{and per barrel} ~~shillings~~
 Dated this Twenty fifth day of October 1832 Two.
