

We Johnstone, Mansfield and Irvine, being Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth, intituled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Donaghmore, in the County of Donegal and Diocese of Derry, do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within said Parish (the Glebe lands of said Parish being excepted) is fourteen hundred and forty pounds of British Currency by the year, of which sum of fourteen hundred and forty pounds, the whole and every part is due and payable to the Rev. Sir John Lighton Bart. as a Composition for the tithe claimable by him as Rector of said Parish. And we do further Certify that the said sum of fourteen hundred and forty pounds is fixed and ascertained as a true and just Composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within said Parish (Glebe lands of said Parish being excepted as aforesaid) by and with the consent and agreement of the said, Rev. Sir John Lighton Bart. the Rector or Incumbent, and who is also Patron of said Parish, and by and with the agreement and consent of the owners and occupiers of land within said Parish in Special Vestry assembled respectively, (and that said agreement and Settlement has received the assent of the Bishop of the Diocese of Derry) in manner and form required by said Acts.
