By the Justices assigned to keep the Peace
in and for the County of Cork assembled at a
General Quarter Sessions held at Skibbereen in
and for the Division of Skibbereen in the West
Riding of the County of Cork on the Thirtieth day
of October One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty
four =

Whereas due notice having been first affixed at the times and in the manner directed by
the Statute in such case made and provided by John Linnick, Thomas Kingston Linnick
and Jane Deasy, persons owners of land in the Parish of Dunagh, in the Division of
Skibbereen and West Riding of the County of Cork, and charged with the annual payment
of three pounds and upwards in respect of the Rent charges payable in lieu of the Composition
for tithes within such Parish made by the certificate of Stephen Barry bearing date the Twenty-
fifth day of June One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty three, and in pursuance of the
Statute in such case made and provided, and whereby the gross amount of composition for
all tithes whatever in said Parish was certified to be the annual sum of Four Hundred
and Eighty pounds sterling, they the said owners of land made application in writing to the
Justices of the Peace at the Quarter Sessions above mentioned, to have the average price of
wheat being the grain in said certificate mentioned, for the preceding seven years in the
Statute in that behalf mentioned, enquired of and ascertained, in order that the said composition
for tithes and the tithe rentcharge in lieu thereof might be diminished according to such
average as compared with the price of One pound Twelve Shillings and ten pence per barrel
being the price of wheat as set forth in said certificate. And Whereas the said applications
and the Reverend William Molesworth Vicar of said Parish, and the Vicars Choral of the Cathedral
Church of St. Fin Barre Cork, owners of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish having appeared by
their Agents before the said Justices at said Quarter Sessions, and the said certificate of
apportionment, notices of application, and the average price of wheat as advertised in the
Dublin Gazette for the said period of seven years, having been proved.

Now the said Justices do ascertain from the said Gazette that the
average price of wheat for the said period of seven years is One pound seven shillings and
two pence for each barrel of Twenty stone. And the said Justices do accordingly order and
adjudge, that the amount of said composition in said Parish and the rentcharge payable
in lieu thereof shall be diminished in proportion to the difference between the said average
price of One pound seven shillings and two pence for the said Period of seven years, and the
average price stated in the said certificate of composition, and that the apportionment of such
composition shall be amended accordingly. And the said Justices do further order that the
said reduction shall take effect from the first day of November One Thousand Eight
Hundred and Fifty four.
