

Commissioners Certificate.

For Twentyone years, without Variation whatever the price of Corn may be  
commencing on the 1 day of November 1831  
We Herbert Donnell, and Daniel Macarty Commissioners, duly appointed, and  
Sworn, under and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of  
King George the fourth Intituled, an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions  
for Tithes in Ireland, for a limited time, to ascertain, and fix a true and  
Just Composition, for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielding, or payable within the  
Parish of Meehan in the Counties of Cork and Kerry, do hereby Certify, that  
the true and just amount, of Compositions for all Tithes whatever, within said  
Parish, is Six Hundred and thirty pounds by the year, whatever the price of Corn  
May be, of which Sum, Three Hundred and fifteen pounds, being a One half  
part, are due and payable, to the Rev. John Charles Morgan, as a Composition  
for the Tithes Claimable by him, as the Vicar of said Parish, and Three Hundred  
and fifteen pounds, the remaining One half part, is due and payable to  
Jeremiah Eugene McCarthy, as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as  
the Lessee, of the Earl of Donoghmore, as Lay Impropriator, and We do further  
Certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said  
Parish, or Counties for the period of Seven years, ending ~~on~~ the first day of  
November, One Thousand Eight hundred, and twenty One, is fifteen Shilling, and two  
pence farthing per Bushel, as Calculated from the Returns advertised in the  
Dublin Gazette during such seven years
