

Duplicate Certificate of Composition

We Henry Longfield and John Mahony  
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and  
by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the  
Reign of King George the Fourth intituled "an Act  
to provide for the establishing of Compositions for  
Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain  
and fix a true and just Composition for <sup>all Tithes</sup> arising  
growing yielded or payable within the Parish of  
Droumdowney in the County of Cork.

Do hereby certify that the true and just  
amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever  
within the said Parish is Fifty Eight Pounds ten  
Shillings <sup>10</sup> by the year of which sum of Fifty Eight  
Pounds ten Shillings <sup>10</sup> by the year the sum of  
Thirty Pounds <sup>10</sup> is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup>  
John Chester as a Composition for the Tithes  
claimable by him as the Vicar of the said Parish  
and the sum of Twenty Eight Pounds ten Shillings  
<sup>10</sup> is due and payable to John Longfield Esquire  
as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him  
as Lay Impropriator of the said Parish.

And we do further certify that the  
average price of Oats being the Corn principally  
grown in the County Cork for the period of seven  
years ending the first of November one thousand  
Eight Hundred and Twenty one is Fifteen Shillings  
and two pence late Irish Currency per Barrel.
