We Abraham Jago and John Deane
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn, under
and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth
year of the reign of His Majesty the fourth, called, An
Act to provide for the establishment of Compositions for
tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and
fix a true and just composition for all tithes, arising,
growing, yielded and payable, within the parish of
Donalogue in the County of Cork — Do hereby
certify that the true and just amount of Composition
for all tithes whatever within the said parish, is Four
Hundred and Fifty pounds British by the year, being
the sum agreed upon between the Parsonages and the
Rev. Mr. Tuckey, Vicar and Rector of said Parish
at a special Vestry held at Donalogue on the 10th in
pursuance of the directions of the above mentioned Act.
It having been also agreed upon at said Vestry that
the said sum of Four hundred and Fifty pounds
British be paid annually in lieu of all tithes for the term
of twenty one years without any variation or alteration
whatsoever —

And we do further certify, that
the average price of wheat, being the corn principally grown
