You are hereby required to take Notice that in pursuance of an Act passed
in the 2nd and 3rd Years of the Reign of his Majesty King William the Fourth entitled
an Act to amend three Acts, passed respectively in the 4th, 5th and in the 7th and 8th Years
of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the
Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions
permanent, I, The Reverend Sir Francis Lynch Slope of Athavallie Chief Landlord,
seized in fee of all that and those the lands of Logatilleen, Bloonduane, Old Curry
and Currybane, Drincurribane, Donamona, Ballydavick, Lippalikane & Bordauna,
Lipplouke, Drum, and Killakilleen, the Miles and Bounds whereof, are as follow;
that is to say, bounded on the North by Lissanishy, on the South by the lands of
Thomastown, Liprobert, and Weatherford, on the East by the lands of Fair Hill,
Garrick-james, Ballaborna, Crooknaveigh, Geestau, Cloghanageera, and Cloghanulcan
on the West by the lands of Lissanishy, Blooncouroughly, Newtown, Curragheat, and
Bloonborough, Situate in the Parish of Drum, Barony of Carr, and County of Mayo,
or being otherwise entitled according to the provisions of the said Act, to agree
for and undertake the payment of the Composition for Tithes Lawfully payable
for and in respect of the said lands, do hereby signify to you my desire to
agree for and undertake the payment of such Composition as aforesaid for and
in respect of the said Lands. And I hereby require you to Grant to me a
certificate in writing conformable to the provisions of the said Act declaring me
entitled to the benefit of this Notice, and to perform the other matters on your
part required by the said Act to be done. —
