We John Allman of Eyecourt and John Mahon of Kennece Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth intituled an Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Drummacoo in the County of Galway do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Fifty three pounds ~~and~~ <sup>eleven</sup> Shillings Sterling by the year of which sum of Fifty three pounds ~~and~~ <sup>eleven</sup> Shillings Fifteen pounds fifteen Shillings are due and payable to John Burke as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish and his Successors Twelve pounds twelve Shillings are due and payable to the Bishop of the Diocese of Clonfert and Kilmacduagh and his Successors Eighteen pounds Eighteen Shillings are due and payable to the Vicar Choral of Christ's Church Dublin and their Successors Six pounds Six Shillings Sterling are due and payable to Henry Martens as Prebendary of Island Cuddy and his Successors

We do further Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of Seven years ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1821 is ten Shillings and Six pence by the Barrel.
