Parish of Beaulieu in the County of South and die
Use of Acreage appointed under and by Virtue
of the Act passed in the 4th year of the Reign
of King George the 4th - Entitled an Act for
Establishing Compensation for tithes in Ireland for a
limited time.

We the Reverend Alexander Johnston
and Francis Donaghoe Esqrs. duly appointed and
 sworn Commissioners, under and by Virtue of an
Act made in the 4th year of the Reign of George
the 4th King - to ascertain and fix a true
and just compensation for all tithes arising growing
yielded or payable within the Parish of Beaulieu
in the County of South and Diocese of Armagh -
Do hereby certify that the true and just compensation
of all tithes whatsoever within the said Parish -
according to the agreement entered into by the
Reverend Jerome Atkey Rector, and the Vestrymen,
of the said Parish, at two Vestries held in and for the
said Parish, one of them on the 16th day of March
1827 and the other on the 30th day of April 1827 -
at the Hundred and five pounds sterling -

And we do further certify that the average
price of wheat and oats, being the principal grain
grown in said County for the period of seven years
ending the 5th day of November 1821 -
was, for wheat - £1:10:0 - and for Oats £0:15:2 1/2
