

At a Vestry held in the Church and for  
the Parish of Beaumaris, according to Notice given  
on Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup> day of April 1827 — in  
the said Vestry being a Special Vestry held by  
Order of His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant,  
on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of April 1827 — for the purpose  
of establishing a composition for twenty one years  
for the tithe of the said Parish pursuant to the pro-  
visions of the tithe Acts of the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> of  
the King —

Resolved that the agreement entered  
into by the Reverend Jerome Allay, with the  
landholders of this parish, at a Vestry held in  
and for the said parish on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of March  
1827 — to wit — That the sum of one  
hundred and five pounds Sterling, shall be  
paid, by half yearly instalments, (the first date to  
be paid on the first day of November next  
1827) to the said Reverend Jerome Allay, for  
twenty one years from the date hereof, as a  
composition for the tithe of said parish, under  
and by virtue of the aforesaid Acts of the 4<sup>th</sup>  
and 5<sup>th</sup> of the King — Be hereby adopted  
and confirmed —

Resolved that we do also consent to  
and confirm the appointment at the said Vestry  
of the 16<sup>th</sup> day of March 1827, of the Reverend  
Alexander Gunster of Beaumaris in the Parish  
of Beaumaris, and Francis Dugay Esq. of  
Newton in the County of Cork, to be the  
Commissioners, for carrying the aforesaid  
agreement into execution,  
according to the Provisions of the said Acts  
of the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> of the King —
