an act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the
fourth, entitled "an act to provide for the establishment of
"Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain
and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising,
growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Drumcree
in the Diocese of Meath and County of Meath, do hereby certify,
that the true and just amount of Composition for all
Tithes whate'er within the said Parish is five hundred
and seven Pounds thirteen Shillings and two pence
halfpenny sterling, by the Year; the whole amount of
which is due and payable unto the Reverend Messrs
Preston, as a Composition for the Tithes by him claimable
as Rector Incumbent of the said Parish. —

And we do further certify that the average Price of Bats
(being the Corn principally grown in such County) for the period of
seven Years, ending on the first day of November, one thousand
eight hundred and twenty one, is fifteen Shillings and
two pence farthing per Barrel
