I Randle Patrick McDonnell, Commissioner
 duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act
 made in the Second and Third years of the Reign of King
 William the Fourth intitled "An Act to amend three Acts
 passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth and Seventh years
 of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth,
 "Providing for the establishing of Composition for Tithes
 "in Ireland and to make such Composition permanent"
 to ascertain and fix a true and Just Composition for all
 Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish
 of Dunlaryon in the County of Meath, do hereby
 Certify that the true and Just amount of Composition for
 all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Thirty
 Six pounds Sterling by the year which sum of Thirty
 Six pounds is due and payable to the Reverend Joseph
 Turner D. D. Rector of the said Parish as a Composition
 of the Tithes claimable by him -

And I do further Certify that the average
 price of wheat being the Corn principally grown in
 said County for the period of Seven years ending on the
 first day of November 1830 is One Pound Twelve
 Shillings and one half penny Sterling - per Barrel -

Having ascertained that the ^(average) Amount of Tithes
 Paid, agreed or adjudged to have been paid in this Parish
 for the Seven years ending November 1st 1830 has been
 Thirty pounds fourteen Shillings, I have increased
 the Composition to the above sum of Thirty six pounds
 on the grounds that the sums which had been paid or
 agreed for during such Seven years, were not adequate Comp-
 -ensation for the Tithes of Corn, wheat having been tithed
 at ten Shillings per Acre, which in other Parishes is
 rated at double that sum, and Flocks Tithes being also very
 imperfectly taken and underrated -
