

We John Johnson and Ralph Dudgeon Commissioners duly
 appointed, and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the
 fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth, entitled an Act
 to provide for the establishing a composition for tithes in Ireland
 for a limited time. To ascertain & fix a true and just composition
 for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of
 Drumsnault Diocese of Clogher and County of Monaghan, do hereby
 certify, that at a Special Vestry held in the Parish Church of
 Drumsnault on the 18th day of October 1825 under the Lord
 Lieutenant's Warrant for holding the same. That Nicholas Ellis Esq.
 (On the part of Sir Thomas Barret Leonard ^{Impropriate Rector})
 and Rev. Allen Mitchell Vicar ^{Lessors of the Appropriate tithes}
 of said Parish of Drumsnault, having proposed to said Vestry to
 take the sum of Two hundred and five pounds Sterling per Annum
 in lieu of all tithes due or payable out of same, and having
 procured the Lord Bishop of Clogher's Assent to the same. And that
 the said Vestry duly assembled unanimously agreed to the same, and
 that the said sum of Two hundred and five pounds Sterling
 per Annum be paid to the said Sir Thomas Barret Leonard and
 Rev. Allen Mitchell or their Successors for the space of Twenty one
 Years from the first day of November 1825
 by two half yearly payments, on every first day of May and
 every first day of November in every Year during said period in lieu
 of all tithes arising growing, yielded or payable out of said
 Parish. And that such Composition shall be invariable for the
 space of Twenty one Years, and shall not be subject to
 any variation by the amount thereof, whatever the price of
 Corn may be
