

We the Reverend John Meade and Henry
Pastable Commissioners duly appointed and
sworn under and by virtue of an act made in
the fourth year of the Reign of King George the
fourth entitled an act to provide for the establishing
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited
time, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition
for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of Dundrum in the County and
Diocese of Cork, do hereby certify that the true
and just amount of composition for all tithes
whatsoever within the said Parish is Five
Hundred and Twenty five Pounds Sterling ^{per}
by the year, of which sum of five hundred and
twenty five pounds ^{the sum of} Four Hundred
and Seventy four Pounds and eight pence farthing
is due and payable to the Reverend Morgan
Dunne as Rector of said Parish, and the
sum of Fifty Pounds nineteen Shillings and
three pence three farthings is due and payable
out of the Howlands of Gortnacloagh Corrin
Ballinphelic and Corlatuder to the Reverend
the Dean and Chapter of Saint Finbarr, Cork
being one third of the composition of the
aforesaid Howlands.
