provide for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a certain  
and Composition for all tithes whatsoever arising growing yielding or payable within the parish of Doonny  
in the County of Galway do hereby Certify that the true and full amount of Composition for all tithes  
whatsoever in said parish is due hereunto and three Pounds fifteen Shillings and four pence that by the  
year there of Eighty four pounds fourteen Shillings and eight pence that is due and payable to the Rev.  
James Francis Oulton as Rector of said Parish, fifteen pounds eighteen Shillings and eight pence  
is due and payable to the Lord Bishop of Clonfert as his lordships proportion, four pounds  
shilling is due and payable to the Rev. Mr. Martin as dean of the diocese of Clonfert and we  
do Certify the average price of oats being the com. principally grown in said County for the  
Period of seven years ending the first day of November 1828 Twenty one is fifteen Shillings and  
Six pence R. Barrall
