Ardfut and Aghadoc, in the County of Kerry, is Twenty Five
Pounds $\text{£} 25$ by the year, of which Sum of Twenty Five Pounds $\text{£} 25$
Twenty Seven Pounds ten Shillings $\text{£} 27$ $\text{s} 10$, is due and
payable to the Rev^d Thomas Goodman, as a Composition for all
the Claimable by him, as Vicar of said Parish, and the remain-
ing Twenty Seven Pounds ten Shillings $\text{£} 27$ $\text{s} 10$ per Annum, is due and
payable to the Right Noble ~~the~~ as Baron Lord ~~Justice~~, as a
Composition for all the Claimable by him as Lay Rector of
said Parish. And we do further Certify that the Average
Price of Oats being the Corn principally grown for the period
of seven years ending the first Day of Nov^r 1821 was
fifteen Shillings and two pence $\text{£} 15$ $\text{s} 2$ per Barrel of Fourteen
Stone
