I John A Waters a Commissioner duly Appointed and Sworn in  
and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and third year of the  
Reign of King William the 4<sup>th</sup> Chap 119 entitled an Act to amend  
three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the  
Seventh and Eight years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the  
Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in  
Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent to Ascertain  
and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising  
growing payable or payable within the Parish of Dummoylan  
in the County of Limerick and Diocese of Limerick, Do  
hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all  
tithes whatever within the said parish is Two hundred and thirty  
Five pounds Sterling of which Sum of Two hundred and thirty Five  
Pounds Sterling the Sum of One hundred and fifty Six pounds  
thirteen Shillings and four pence Sterling is Due and payable to  
William Morgan Esq<sup>r</sup> the Lessee of the Right Honourable the Earl  
of Cork and Erris for the tithes claimable by him as Lay  
Impropriator the Sum of Seventy Eight pounds Six Shillings  
and eight pence Sterling is Due and payable to the Reverend  
Mr. Graves as Vicar of said Parish, and his Successors and  
I do further Certify that the average prices for wheat and oats being the  
Cereals principally grown in said County for the period of seven years  
ended on the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty  
are for wheat per Barrel of Twenty Stone one pound twelve shillings  
and a half penny British, and for oats per Barrel of fourteen Stone  
twelve shillings and eleven pence half penny British
