

Mr Edward Medlicott ^{Junr} of Dummurray and
Rev^d William Cox of Kildare. Commissioners duly appointed
and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in
the 4th year of the Reign of King George The Fourth, intituled
an Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for
Tithes in Ireland for a given time, to ascertain and fix
a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing,
yielded, or payable within the Parish of Dummurray in
the County and Diocese of Kildare, do hereby certify that
the true, and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes
whatevver within the said Parish is seventy five Pounds
British by the year. Which sum is due and payable
to the Rev^d Henry Hamilton as a Composition for
the Tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of said
Parish. And We do further certify that the Average
Price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such
County, for the Period of seven years next preceeding the First
day of Nov^r 1821 was one Pound eighteen Shillings and
Eight pence halfpenny (late Irish Currency) per Barrel.
