

We Thomas Gale and John Deane Commissioners appointed
 and sworn under and by Virtue of an act made in the Fourth
 Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth intituled "An
 Act to Provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in
 Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and
 Just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or
 payable within the Parish of Ballinakille or Dysert Galen in the
 Queen's County do hereby certify, that the true and just amount
 of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish
 is Four hundred and Forty Pounds by the Year. Of which
 Sum the whole and entire is due and payable to The Rev^d
 Steward Legon French as a Composition for the Tithes claimable
 by him as Rector & Vicar of the said Parish - And we do
 further certify that the average Price of Oats being the
 Corn principally grown in such County for the Period of
 Seven years ending on the 1st day of November 1821 was
 fifteen shillings and two pence farthing the Barrell
 dated this 1st day of July 1824 from

Altho the Sum stated or agreed for at Special Vestry was
 Four hundred Pounds in lieu of all Tithes payable out of said
 Parish, yet on examining the average Sums paid for Tithes in said
 Parish for the years commencing 1st November 1814 and ending
 1st Novem^r 1821 we find the Sum of Four hundred and Forty Pounds
 the average Sum paid for Tithes for said Years and we have
 accordingly certified for that Sum.
