

We Thomas Antelott and Robert Mitchell Commissioners appointed
and severally under and by Virtue of an Act made in the
fourth Year of the Reign of King George the fourth entitled
an Act to Provide for the Establishing a Composition for
Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix
a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing
yielded or payable within the Parish of Clogher in the
County's of Monaghan and Tyrone and Diocese of Clogher
Do Certify that a Special Vestry held in the Parish Church
of Clogher on the first Day of July 1826 under and by
Virtue of the Lord Lieutenant's Warrant for holding the
same that William B: Wade Esq: Rector of the Appropriate
Tithes of said Parish having offered to said Vestry to take
the sum of Four Hundred pounds Sterling per Annum in lieu
of all Tithes due or payable out of same and having procured
the Lord Bishop of Clogher's Assent to the same. And that
the said Vestry duly Assembled Unanimously agreed to the
same And that the said sum of Four Hundred Pounds per
Annum be paid to the said William B: Wade or his Heirs
Executors, Administrators or Assigns for the Space of
Twenty One Years from the first Day of November 1826
by two half Yearly Payments on every first Day of May
and first Day of November during said period in lieu of
all Tithes arising, Growing, Yielded or payable out of said
Parish and that £4 said Composition shall be inviolable
for the Space of Twenty One Years and shall not be subject
to any Variation in the Amount thereof whatever the price of
Cattle may be. Which we Certify this 21st Day of August 1826
