The Reverend Richard Hawkshaw, Master of Arts  
Rector of the Parish of Fahan in the Diocese of Deny  
do hereby consent to the setting off and separating the  
several Towns and Lands of Luddan, Granchagh, Ballynacary  
Irelig, Ardavin (Buncrana), Tullydovish, Ballymagaur  
Tullyavil, Ballynary, Minagory, Meadron, Dinteston,  
Cowanboy, Lillesky, Kinnagor, Poffinagh, Cragcaunon  
(Cronagh) Mindecallagh and Ellies, part of the said  
parish of Fahan from the remaining part of said  
parish and to the erecting the same into a new Parish  
distinct from the said Parish of Fahan to be called  
and known by the name of the parish of Lower  
Fahan by the Lord Bishop of Deny, pursuant to an  
Act of Parliament made in this Kingdom in the  
Eleventh and twelfth years of the reign of his present  
Majesty King George the Third, Intituled An Act for  
Erecting Parochial Chapels of Ease in parishes of  
large Extent, and making such Chapels and those that  
are already Erected Perpetual Cures and for making  
a proper provision for the Maintenance of Perpetual  
Curates to officiate in the same, and also in like manner  
for making appropriate parishes perpetual Cures.
