Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and  
by virtue of an act made in the fourth Year of the  
Reign of King George the fourth intituled an act to  
provide for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in  
Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true  
and just Composition for all tithes growing arising  
yielding or payable within the Parish of Tully in the  
County of Galway do hereby certify that the true and just  
Amount of Composition for all tithes whatsoever within the  
said Parish is twenty four Pounds ten Shillings Sterling by  
the Year of which Sum of twenty four Pounds ten Shill-  
ings Sterling twenty seven Pounds Sterling is due and  
payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Doctor Eyre as a Composition for the tithes  
claimable by him as Rector of Tully and his success-  
ors thirty five Pounds Sterling is due and payable to the  
Lord Bishop of Clonfert and Kilmacduagh for the tithes  
claimable by him as Bishop and his Successors  
and twelve Pounds ten Shillings Sterling are due and  
payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Maurice Mahon and his Successors  
and we do further certify that the average price of oats  
being the Corn principally growing in such County  
for the period of seven Years ending the 21<sup>st</sup> day of  
November 1821 is ten Shillings and six pence by the Bush  
Signed Seals and delivered this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September  
one thousand eight hundred and twenty six =
