

him. But neither at nor
the copy with Rawson will
give you all the information
you require. As so many
deaths have occurred since
the dates of those books, that
the names which they supply
will be found to differ very
much from the actual ones
now. Rawson's books was
corrected up to that date,
you will be obliged to borrow
from other sources the names
as given for the respective
inhabitants. I suppose the
collector of County Cops. or
the Booths at the poor house
would give them County
& Countyman living at
one side of Loughkeel,
for the price of a pair
of shoes, furnished me only
with a correct list, & all
the particulars respecting
the inhabitants.
Had I been resident in

in the County, I could
have made those persons
pay regularly; but since
I am not, I could not remain
and so they were permitted to
fall into their old habits.
They have not generally speak
ing, paid anything since I
in Loughkeel (with the exception of
one O'Hear) in that part
of Balrinyan about the Police
Barracks. Their Holdings are
so small that you can not
institute legal proceedings
except in the Civil Bill
Court of the Barons; &
the costs allowed for a Decree
in that Court, would not
at all cover the expenses
of proving your case. For
this & other reasons, I would
advise you to take proceedings
at Law; but Equity will af-
ford you an easy & most
effective remedy. In my father's
case, there were 4 Bills filed.
