

Gazette was fourteen shillings and nine pence half penny sterling good and lawful money of Great Britain and Ireland

And it appearing by the Certificate bearing date the Troody eighth day of May 1825, as well as by the Original assessment and applotment of the Commissioners appointed under the acts of the 4<sup>th</sup> George the 4<sup>th</sup> Chap 99 and 5<sup>th</sup> George 4<sup>th</sup> Chap 63, to ascertain ~~the~~ and fix, a true and just Composition for all tithes arising growing and payable within the said Parish, produced to us, by the Deputy Registrar of the said Diocese of Leighlin, and given in evidence before us, on behalf of the said Applicant, that Oats was the Measure of Composition for Tithes in said Parish of Tenagh, and that the average price of Oats per barrel for the seven years preceding the first day of November 1821, was fifteen shillings and two pence farthing late Irish Currency being fourteen shillings British Currency, and that in consequence thereof they the said Commissioners had fixed the amount of the Composition for Tithes in said Parish of Tenagh at £700. Annually late Irish Currency that is to say £160 as the Rectorial Tithes and £251 as the Vicarial Tithes due and payable as in said Certificate mentioned,

And it further appearing to us the said Justices that the Annual Rent Charge payable in lieu thereof amounted to the sum of £484. 12. 5 present Currency,

And it further appearing to us the said Justices by said Order bearing date the third day of April 1854 and made by the Justices then assembled at a quarter sessions at Carlow aforesaid that in pursuance of the application of certain persons who were charged with the payment of £3 or upwards in respect of the Tithe Rent Charge of said Parish, the said Justices ascertained that the average price of Oats for the seven years preceding the first day of November 1853 was twelve shillings and three pence sterling per barrel, and accordingly the said Justices by said Order reduced the said Annual Rent Charge of £484. 12. 5 by a sum of £60. 11. 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> being the one eighth thereof and ordered that said annual Rent Charge should be £424. 0. 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> instead of £484. 12. 5 and that same should be payable as therein mentioned from the first day of November 1853,

And it further appearing to us the said Justices that the said Hans Atkinson has supported his said application by evidence, and We having ascertained by the said Report of said William Raymond Fitzmaurice that the average price of good marketable oats per barrel for the last seven years was fourteen shillings and nine pence half penny present Currency and that same is a larger price than that mentioned either in the said Certificate of said Commissioners, or in the said Order of the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1854

We do therefore order adjudge and Decree that the said Tithe Rent Charge in lieu of Composition for Tithes in said Parish so ascertained and Certified by the said Commissioners to be £484. 12. 5 annually be increased by a sum of £28. 10. 2 sterling being the one ~~seventeenth~~ part of the said Tithe Rent Charge, and that same shall now be £513. 2. 7 Sterling annually instead of £484. 12. 5 as Certified by said Commissioners and instead of £424. 0. 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> as varied by said Order of the third day of April 1854 said annual sum of

£513. 2. 7 to be paid and payable to the parties entitled thereto in the same manner and proportions as the said Tithe Composition and Rent Charge in lieu thereof under said Commissioners Certificate and said Order of the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1854 respectively had been heretofore payable and that the same shall commence and be payable from the first day of November 1860
