

Year, for Twenty one years from
first November 1824 and that
the said sum of Twenty eight
Pounds late Irish currency shall
be according to the amount of
composition of one third of all
the Tithes of said Parish to which
the Rev. the Moore Attorney and
Ecclesiastical Incumbent is entitled.
And whereas it appears that
the Dean and Chapter of St.
Patrick's Cathedral in the City
of Dublin aforesaid are
entitled to two thirds of all
the Tithes arising growing, yielded
and payable within the said
Parish of Friendstown in the (or)
of Wicklow aforesaid. we do here
by certify that the sum of Fifty six
Pounds late Irish currency shall
be the amount of Two thirds

of all the Tithes of said Parish to
which the said Dean and Chap
ter are entitled.

And we further certify that
the average price of oats, being the
corn principally grown in the said
County for the period of seven years
ending on the first of November 1821
was fifteen shillings and two
pence farthing per Bushel -
