

Galbooly Parish. The Vicars Certificate.

WE William Palmer of Sturcourt Street in the City of Dublin Esq^r and Daniel Gwyder of Grove Lodge in the County of Tipperary Esq^r Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made and passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" and of an Act made and passed in the Fifth Year of His Majesties Reign, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act of the last Session of Parliament for providing for the Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland" and of an Act made and passed in the Seventh and Eighth Years of His Majesties Reign, intituled, "An Act to amend the Acts for the Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland", to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for the portion of Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable, within the Parish of Galbooly, in the Diocese of Cashel belonging to the Vicar of said Parish, Do hereby Certify, that the true and just Amount of Compositions for said Tithes, is the Sum of Fifty Five Pounds Sterling by the Year, which sum is due and payable to the Reverend Richard French Lawrence as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish: the said Annual Sum of Fifty Five Pounds having been agreed to by the said Richard French Lawrence and by the Special Vestry duly called and assembled under the provision of the said Acts in the Parish of Galbooly on Wednesday the Eleventh day of April last in the following words, viz, "that the Sum of Fifty Five Pounds shall be paid as the Annual Composition for the said Vicars share of the Tithes, that is to say, for one third of the Great Tithes, together with the entire Tithes of Meadow, Sheep and Lambs", and which said agreement was assented to in writing by His Grace Richard Lord Archbishop of Cashel Patron of said Benefice

And WE do further Certify, that the Average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of Seven Years ending on the First day of November 1821, according to a Schedule thereof furnished by the Rt^h Honble Henry Goulburn late Chief Sec^r to the Lord Lieu^t of Ireland, is one Pound Eighteen Shillings and eight pence half penny late Currency, or one Pound Fifteen Shillings and eight pence three farthings Brit. Post Road.
