

Galbally Parish. Copy of Agreement between the Impropriators and the Special Vestry.

It is hereby agreed upon by and between Nathaniel Taylor of Noan Esq: and Mrs Mary Downes Impropriate Ffith Owners of the Parish of Galbally, Diocese of Cashel and County of Tipperary, and a Special Vestry duly and legally assembled in said Parish under and by virtue of two Acts of Parliament passed in the Fourth and Fifth Years of the Reign of King George the Fourth Chap. 99 & 63, that the Sum of Fifty Five Pounds British Annually shall be the Amount of Composition to be paid for the Ffiths of Two thirds of the Tillage in said Parish, the said Impropriators reserving a right of seeking to recover other proportions of the Ffiths of said Parish now withheld by the Ecclesiastical Incumbent the Reverend Richard French Lawrence which they conceive they have a legal claim to. Dated this 22^d day of January 1828.

Galbally Parish. The Impropriators Certificate.

We William Palmer and Daniel Gwyder Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made and passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Establishment of Compositions for Ffiths in Ireland for a limited time" and of two subsequent Acts made and passed in the Fifth and Eighth Years of His Majesties Reign, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for the portion of Ffiths, arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Galbally in the Diocese of Cashel and County of Tipperary belonging to the Impropriator of said Parish, Do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount

of Composition for said Ffiths, is the Sum of Fifty Five Pounds Sterling by the Year, which sum is due and payable to the Impropriator or Impropriators as a Composition for the Ffiths claimable by him or them as owner or owners of the Great Ffiths of said Parish of Galbally: the said Annual Sum of Fifty Five Pounds having been agreed to by Nathaniel Taylor Esq: one of said Owners and by the Special Vestry, duly called and assembled under the provisions of the said Acts in the Parish of Galbally on Tuesday the Twenty second day of January last, in manner following, viz, "that the Sum of Fifty Five Pounds British Annually, shall be the Amount of Composition to be paid to the Impropriators for the Ffiths of Two thirds of the Tillage in said Parish", and which said agreement was assented to by Mrs Mary Downes the other Owner of said Ffiths.

And We do further Certify, that the average price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period of Seven Years ending on the 1st day of November 1821, according to a Schedule thereto furnished by the R^t Hon^rble Henry Goulburn late Chief Sec^r to the Lord Sec^r of Ireland, is One Pound Eighteen Shillings & Eight pence halfpenny late Currency, or One Pound Fifteen Shillings & Eight pence Three farthings British per Barrel. Dated this 1st day of February 1828.
