King George the 3^d providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland and to make such Composition permanent, and to ascertain and
give a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing, yielding or
payable within the Parish of Garristown in the County of Dublin, and
Diocese of Dublin, do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for all Tithes what ever within the said Parish is Two hundred
and Thirty Pounds - by the year, of which sum of Two hundred
and Thirty Pounds - One hundred and Eighty Pounds of year
are due and payable to John Thomas - Lord Bacon Timplerton
as Owner of the Rectorial Tithe, Or as Lay Impropriator, and Fifty Pounds
of year is due and payable to the Reverend Godfrey Escoth, as owner of the
vicarial Tithes of the said Parish, and I do further ^{certify} that the average price
of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period
of 7 years ending on the 1st Day of November 1830 is £1-12-0⁰/₁₀₀ of Bad
