King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to provide for
the Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a
limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within
the Parish of Glasnevin in the Diocese and County of Dublin,
Do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of Compo-
sition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is one
Hundred and Eighty Four Pounds Sterling by the Year, of which
Sum of one Hundred and Eighty Four Pounds, one Moiety is due
and payable to the Reverend William Robinson A.M. as Precentor
of the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity Dublin, and one
Moiety is due and payable to the Reverend Stewart Segar French
Esq. as Chancellor of the said Cathedral Church, as a Composition
for the Tithes claimable by them as Owners of the Tithes great and
small of the said Parish of Glasnevin. —————

————— And We do further Certify, that the Average price
of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such County for
the period of Seven Years, ending on the First day of November
1821, according to a Schedule thereof furnished by the Right
Hon^{ble} Henry Goulburn Chief Sec^y to the Lord Lieutenant of
Ireland, is one Pound Eighteen Shillings and eight pence half penny
late Currency, or one Pound Fifteen Shillings and eight pence
Three fourths British per Barrel. —————
