Certificate of Composition for the Parish of  
Glenbane in the County of Tipperary and in the  
Diocese of Emly

I William Gullins Commissioner duly appointed & sworn under and by  
virtue of an act made in the second & third years of the reign of King William  
the fourth Intituled an act to amend three acts passed respectively in  
the fourth, fifth & in the seventh & eighth years of the reign of His late  
Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing of composition  
for tithes in Ireland & to make such compositions permanent, To ascertain  
& fix a true & just composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded, or  
payable, within the Parish of Glenbane in the County of Tipperary &  
in the Diocese of Emly, Do hereby certify that the true and just amt  
of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish of  
Glenbane is Forty seven pounds eleven shillings & Six  
Pence by the year, which sum is due and payable to the Very  
Rev<sup>d</sup> Tho<sup>s</sup> Philip Sifanus Dean of Emly as a composition for the tithes  
claimable by him as Rector of said Parish of Glenbane.

And I do further certify that  
the average price of oats being the Corn principally grown in such  
County for the period of seven years ending on the thirty first day of  
October one thousand eight hundred & thirty is twelve shillings and  
seven pence half penny Per Barrel
