

2 and 3rd William 4th Chap 119

J. Burke White Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by
virtue of an act made in the second and third year of the reign of
King William the fourth Chap 119 entitled an act to amend three acts
passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth
years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing
for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland and to make such
compositions permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just composition
for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of
Grange East in the County of Limerick and Diocesis of Limerick do hereby
certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes
whatsoever within the said Parish is eighty three pounds six shillings
and two pence sterling by the year, and which sum of eighty three
pounds six shillings and two pence sterling is due and payable to
M^r Joseph Jones of the City of Limerick Lessee of Lord Southwell
Lay proprietor as a Composition for the tithes claimable by him
as Lessee of the said Parish -

And I do further certify that the average price of Wheat and
Oats being the corn principally grown in said County for the period
of seven years ending on the first day of November one thousand
eight hundred and thirty are for wheat one pound twelve shillings
and one half penny sterling per barrel of twenty stone and for Oats twelve
shillings and eleven pence half penny per barrel of fourteen stone
