

WE, John Allman of Cynecourt, and James Mahon of Beech Hill in the County of Galway Esqrs Commissioners  
duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King  
George the Fourth, Entituled an Act to provide for the establishing of compositions of compositions for tithes in  
Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just amount of composition for all tithes arising  
growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Grange in the County of Galway and Diocese of Clonfert  
do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within  
the said Parish is Fifty Nine pounds Sterling by the year of which sum of Fifty Nine pounds  
Sterling the sum of Nine pounds Sterling is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Thomas Buryoy as  
a Composition for the tithes claimable by him as Sacristan of Clonfert Church and his successors  
The sum of Fifty pounds Sterling is due and payable to the Vicars Chorals of Christs Church Dublin  
and their successors, as a Composition for the tithes claimable by them in said Parish  
And we do further certify that the average price of oats being the corn principally growing  
in such County for the period of seven years, ending on the first day of November One  
thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty One (1821) is Ten Shillings and Six pence  
by the Board Signed Sealed and Delivered this 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1827 Seven
