

I William Young being duly appointed and sworn Commissioner
under and by virtue of an act made in the 2nd & 3rd years of the Reign
of King William the Fourth Chapter 119 entitled an Act to
amend the acts passed respectively in the 4th, 5th, 7th and 8th years
of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth
relating for the Establishment of Composition of Tithes in
Ireland, and to make such compositions permanent (16th August
1833) to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all
Tithes arising, growing, yielding, or payable within the Parish
of ^{Grangeforth} ~~Grangeforth~~ in the County of Carlow do certify that the true
and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever in
said Parish is Two hundred and sixty four Pounds by the year
and that the said sum of Two hundred and sixty four Pounds
is payable to the Reverend Thomas Brooke as a composition
for all Tithes claimed by him as Rector of said Parish of
Grangeforth, And I do further certify that the average price
of wheat being the Corn principally ground in said County
for the periods of seven years ending the first of November 1830
is one Pound Twelve Shillings per Barrel
