

in said Parish of Grangeforth, and that the average price of Wheat per barrell for the seven years preceding the first day of November 1830 was One Pound Twelve Shillings per Barrell and that in consequence thereof the said Commissioner had fixed the amount of the Composition for Tithe in said Parish of Grangeforth at £264 Sterling by the year, and that same was due and payable to the then Rector of said Parish as in said Certificate mentioned

And it further appearing to us the said justices that the annual Rent Charge payable in lieu thereof amounted to the sum of £198 Sterling

And it further appearing to us the said justices that by said order of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1855 in pursuance of the application of certain persons who were charged with the payment of £3 or upwards in respect of the Tithe Rent Charge of said Parish the justices therein named ascertained that the average price of Wheat for the seven years preceding the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1854 was £1-7-1/2 per barrell and accordingly the said justices by the said order reduced the said Tithe Composition by a sum of £40.4.0 Sterly and ordered that said Tithe Composition should be £223.16.0 instead of said sum of £264 subject to be reduced pursuant to the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Victoria C 109 and that same subject to such reduction should be payable as therein mentioned from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1854

And it further appearing to us the said justices that the said Robert Wright has supported his said application by evidence and we having ascertained by the said Report of said William Raymond Fitzmaurice that the average price of good marketable Wheat per barrell for the last seven years was £1-12-7 Sterling and that same is a larger price than that mentioned either in the said Certificate of said Commissioner or in the said order of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1855

We do therefore order adjudge and Decree that the said Tithe Rent Charge in lieu of Composition for Tithe in said Parish so ascertained and Certified by the said Commissioner to be £198 annually, be increased by a sum of £3-12-3 being about the one fifty fifth part of the said Tithe Rent Charge and that same shall now be £201-12-3 Sterling annually instead of £198 as Certified by said Commissioner and instead of £167-17-0 (equal to £223-16-0 Tithe Composition) as Varied by said order of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1855 said annual sum of £201-12-3 being the product of 165 barrells of Wheat at £1-12-0 per barrell and £268.16.3 being the product of a like number of barrells at £1-12-7 per barrell which said sum of £268.16.3 being reduced by one fourth pursuant to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Vict C 109 makes the said sum of £201.12.3 which said last mentioned sum is to be paid and payable to the party entitled thereto in the same manner and proportions as the said Tithe Composition and Rent Charge in lieu thereof under said Commissioner's Certificate and said order of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1855 respectively had been heretofore payable and that the same shall commence and be payable from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1861
