

I. Arthur Belcher of Glengrove Lodge, Commissioner, duly appointed  
and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act. made in the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> years of  
the Reign of King William the IV intituled an Act. to amend three  
Acts, pass<sup>d</sup> respectively in the 1<sup>st</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> & in the 17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup> years of the  
Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the  
establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such  
Composition permanent, to ascertain and fix a true & just Composition  
for all the Tithes arising growing or payable within the Parish of  
Milree, or Grange Milree, in the County of Wick. do hereby  
Certify that the true & just amount of Compositions for all the Tithes  
whatsoever within the said Parish is One Hundred & four Pounds Ster<sup>l</sup>  
which is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Richard Butler as a Composition  
for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector & Vicar of said Parish.

And I do further Certify that the Average price of  
Wheat being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period  
of Seven years ending on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of October 1830 (Thirty)  
is One Pound twelve Shillings & one halfpenny per Barrel.
